In hot (or rather quite chilly) pursuit will be **Eddy Lane** ARPS, DPAGB, EFIAP, APAGB and **Pam Lane** ARPS, DPAGB, EFIAP, APAGB, with a welcome return visit to Stroud CC and their talk **"Svalbard, Kingdom of the Ice Bear"** on 6th October – again an "in person" talk at the Bowls Club.

20th October will see **Simon Pizzey** (local photographer with Stroud News & Journal) enthralling us with a more historical photographic evening – as he takes us to a non-digital realm, with his talk about how he uses Victorian techniques today to add a further dimension to his photographic experience. Our Stroud Camera Club Facebook group (https://www.facebook.com/groups/313890382 053975) is a vibrant welcoming environment in which to share your images.

It is very simple to join the group, just navigate using the web address above, and click on the "Join" button.

We try not to impose too many "rules" as we are always looking to encourage sharing of images, and knowledge. However, we do restrict the posting of images to members only. Nonmembers can comment and "like" images.

This group is a public one, meaning anyone "on trying something new, or just saw Facebook" can view the content; it is thus very something interesting? How did you create much a window to Stroud Camera Club. With your image? Etc. This type of information this in mind, we would ideally like members to will make our group informative to fellow give some thought to the images that they post.

Due to the way Facebook showcases images, it is also preferable if members upload a single image rather than multiple images. A single image will be seen at an optimized size within the feed and draw attention, whereas a multiple image upload will generally show three or four your "likes" but also think about offering small images with a large "+" sign through one comments, in particular if feedback has been of the images as well. Of course, the full image requested. Any issues get in touch with may not be seen until "clicked on"

We all know that any image needs to grab the viewers' attention: researchers have concluded that it takes just 13 milliseconds for our brain to see an image – and then we have a maximum of 8 seconds to hold their attention, so if they are looking at your post and don't immediately see anything interesting they will pass over it, and certainly won't bother clicking on the "+" sign to look at the other images you have put together!

We would also suggest that some commentary is included with your image; why did you take the image? What were your settings? Were you

2022 competitive

The new season starts 8th September 2022 and this will be the first competition hand-in deadline. Remember to refer to the website for deadlines and get your DPI images uploaded to your competition page before midnight.

A brief reminder that it was agreed at the AGM there will be no groups and to revert to a scoring system of 0-20 (generally we will see judges awarding in the 15 - 20 area). Remember that a score is only a way of the judge differentiating his opinion of each image presented when compared to the others presented on that night. At the end of the evening the judge will also give his "Judge's Choice" – so his or her personal choice of "best image" from the night.

We will once again be looking for both **Prints and Digital** entries and remember that it is from these entries (in particular up to November for any new images) that our entry for both DPIC and the Battles will be selected. We really want to encourage a wide entry and remember that the most important aspect of judging is the critique you will be receiving. This season, as well as some familiar faces amongst the judges, we will be welcoming 3 new judges, so different styles of judging are bound to be in evidence.
